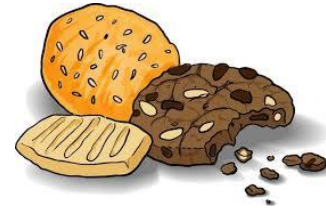

The Fourth Annual Terrington, Wiganthorpe & Ganthorpe Village Produce Show will take place on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

The show will cover 79 Classes, grouped into 10 broader Categories. The Classes are open to everyone resident in Terrington, Wiganthorpe and Ganthorpe; the Junior Classes are open to all Juniors regardless of residency (e.g. grandchildren of residents, all pupils at the school, etc.).

We hope you will enter exhibits into the Produce Show and we invite you to take a look through the array of Classes listed in this schedule. An entry form has been included loose within this booklet. Entry of an exhibit into a Class will cost 75p for adults and 25p for 16s and under. The more entries there are, the more fun the show will be. Each person can only submit one entry per Class but can submit entries to as many of the Classes as they like. All the entries will be judged independently by judges from outside of our villages and the judges will not know which people have submitted which exhibits.

You can support the event by coming to the show on the day even if you don't feel ready to enter an exhibit of your own. Admission to the show will be just £1 for adults and free for 16s and under. There will be free admission for exhibitors.

Prize cards will be awarded to the winners of each Class, and cups & trophies awarded to the best in each of the broader Categories.

At the end of the show, exhibits will be raffled off. Money raised will go towards further improvements of the Village Hall. Exhibitors will be given the opportunity to remove their exhibit from the raffle if they want to keep them.

The Categories and Classes are shown below and on the following pages.

**Please note: If you want to enter into class FV14, or if any juniors want to enter classes J6, J12 or J18, you will need to let us know before 8<sup>th</sup> April. See following pages for details.**

### HINTS FOR EXHIBITORS

**Read this schedule carefully:** Make sure you have displayed the right number of flowers, vegetables, scones, etc. and that your exhibit is the correct size.

**Flowers and Vegetables:** The judges will look for regularity and uniformity in an exhibit - each item should be of similar size and quality. Flower petals should ideally not have holes or other damage. Vegetables should look fresh and be edible. They should be clean and trimmed. If picked overnight they are best kept cool and damp. Presentation may be helped by arranging your specimens on a paper plate.

**Have A Go:** Do please have a go in any of the Classes. You may be surprised how well your entries measure up. The more entries there are, the more fun the show will be so please consider entering something. You never know..... you could be a trophy winner in September!

## COOKERY CATEGORY

*All entries must be the exhibitor's own work. Exhibits should all be presented cold and covered with cling film or in a container.*

<b>C1</b>	4 bread rolls or 1 loaf of bread (can be flavoured)
<b>C2</b>	1 Victoria sponge (8" round, raspberry jam, no cream, sugar dusted top)
<b>C3</b>	4 sausage rolls (made with shortcrust pastry)
<b>C4</b>	1 jar of fruit jam or jelly (made in last 12 months, max. 1lb jar)
<b>C5</b>	1 jar of lemon curd (made in last 12 months, max. 1lb jar)
<b>C6</b>	1 jar of marmalade (made in last 12 months, max. 1lb jar)
<b>C7</b>	1 jar named pickle, ketchup or chutney (made in last 12 months, max. 1lb jar)
<b>C8</b>	4 scones (sweet or savoury)
<b>C9</b>	6 cheese straws
<b>C10</b>	4 cup cakes or muffins made with a vegetable and decorated showing the veg. used
<b>C11</b>	1 cake of any type, decorated to celebrate the Queen's 70 <sup>th</sup> jubilee
<b>C12</b>	1 chocolate cake made to our set recipe (see <b>Note 1</b> below)

## PHOTOGRAPHY CATEGORY

*All entries must be exhibitor's own work, taken in the last 12 months, and max A4 size*

<b>P1</b>	Wildlife in my garden
<b>P2</b>	A humorous photo with a caption
<b>P3</b>	Water
<b>P4</b>	Agricultural machinery
<b>P5</b>	A walk in the woods
<b>P6</b>	A gate
<b>P7</b>	My favourite place
<b>P8</b>	A portrait
<b>P9</b>	Black & white / Monochrome (any subject)

## FRUIT & VEGETABLES CATEGORY

*All entries must be home grown by exhibitors*

<b>FV1</b>	3 apples (named variety if known)
<b>FV2</b>	6 soft fruits of any one type (e.g. blackberry)
<b>FV3</b>	3 dressed onions
<b>FV4</b>	3 dressed carrots
<b>FV5</b>	1 cabbage
<b>FV6</b>	4 potatoes of any named variety
<b>FV7</b>	3 beetroot of any named variety
<b>FV8</b>	4 tomatoes of any named variety
<b>FV9</b>	3 chillies of any named variety
<b>FV10</b>	6 beans (unshelled) of any named variety
<b>FV11</b>	4 different vegetables on a tray (including at least one salad vegetable)
<b>FV12</b>	One vegetable and one bloom
<b>FV13</b>	6 home-laid eggs
<b>FV14</b>	<b>(a)</b> Heaviest yield from a seed potato which we will provide (see <b>Note 2</b> below)
	<b>(b)</b> Heaviest individual potato in the yield (see <b>Note 2</b> below)

## FLOWERS CATEGORY

*All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor*

<b>F1</b>	Your garden in a vase (maximum 12 stems)
<b>F2</b>	A single stem (e.g. rose, dahlia, gladiolus, etc.)
<b>F3</b>	A basket of roses
<b>F4</b>	A harvest arrangement in a vase
<b>F5</b>	Flowers & foliage arrangement to depict the seaside
<b>F6</b>	Flower arrangement in a teapot
<b>F7</b>	A buttonhole for a wedding
<b>F8</b>	3 flowers of any kind (same size and colour)

## HANDICRAFT CATEGORY

*All entries must be exhibitor's own work and made in the last 12 months.*

<b>H1</b>	One patchwork or quilted item
<b>H2</b>	One item of cross-stitch (framed or unframed)
<b>H3</b>	Something new from something old
<b>H4</b>	One hand-knitted item
<b>H5</b>	Any article of embroidery or sewing
<b>H6</b>	A soft toy suitable for a child
<b>H7</b>	One crocheted piece
<b>H8</b>	Any other item of handicraft not otherwise stated

## ART CATEGORY

*All entries must be exhibitor's own work, done in the last 12 months.*

<b>A1</b>	An original, framed or mounted painting or drawing (max frame size 18" x 24") (Please attach a card to the mount/frame providing a title for the work)
<b>A2</b>	A design for a child's bedroom wallpaper
<b>A3</b>	A bookmark (any medium)
<b>A4</b>	A collage (any medium, max size 18" x 24")
<b>A5</b>	A greeting card (any occasion)

## CREATIVE WRITING CATEGORY

*All entries must be exhibitor's own work, and maximum of 1 side of A4 and 250 words.*

<b>CW1</b>	Wording in a card (any occasion; can buy or make the card)
<b>CW2</b>	My wildlife garden
<b>CW3</b>	A childhood memory
<b>CW4</b>	A limerick including the phrase "old man"
<b>CW5</b>	My favourite season

## JUNIOR CATEGORY – AGES 6 AND UNDER

J1	Two family members painted on hard boiled eggs (can add material for hair, etc.) (Please also provide a sealed envelope containing a photo of the people portrayed)
J2	A Lego model of your own design (not a specific kit) (Please provide a name/description of the model on a card with the exhibit)
J3	A salt dough model
J4	A mask made from a paper plate
J5	Cress growing in a recycled container
J6	Tallest sunflower grown from a seed which we will provide (see <b>Note 3</b> below)

## JUNIOR CATEGORY – AGES 7 TO 12

J7	Two family members painted on hard boiled eggs (can add material for hair, etc.) (Please also provide a sealed envelope containing a photo of the people portrayed)
J8	A drawing or painting (maximum A4 size)
J9	4 biscuits, any flavour
J10	An animal made from pieces of fruit or vegetables
J11	Herbs growing in a recycled container
J12	Tallest sunflower grown from a seed which we will provide (see <b>Note 3</b> below)

## JUNIOR CATEGORY – AGES 13 TO 16

J13	Two family members painted on hard boiled eggs (can add material for hair, etc.) (Please also provide a sealed envelope containing a photo of the people portrayed)
J14	An upcycled wellington boot
J15	4 jam tarts
J16	A painted stone
J17	A miniature garden on a plate (max 25cm)
J18	Tallest sunflower grown from a seed which we will provide (see <b>Note 3</b> below)

**Note 1:** Entries of a chocolate cake for class C12 must follow this recipe.

**Ingredients:** For the cake: 200g golden caster sugar, 200g softened unsalted butter (plus extra for the tins), 4 large eggs, 200g self-raising flour, 2 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 tsp baking powder, ½ tsp vanilla extract, 2 tbsp milk, pinch of salt. For the buttercream: 50g milk chocolate (chopped), 100g softened butter, 200g icing sugar (plus extra to dust the top), 3 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 tbsp milk, pinch of salt.

*Method: Preheat oven to 190° (170° fan); butter two 20cm (8in) round sandwich tins and line with baking parchment; beat together all the cake ingredients and mix until pale; divide between the two tins; bake for 20 mins and leave to cool for 10 mins before turning out to cool completely. For the buttercream, melt the chopped chocolate and leave to cool for 5 mins; beat the softened butter and icing sugar together then add the sifted cocoa powder a pinch of salt and the milk and mix until smooth; sandwich the cakes together with the buttercream in the middle; dust the top with a little more icing sugar.*

**Note 2:** For class FV14, the Village Hall will supply exhibitors with a seed potato and a bag in April in which exhibitors must cultivate the potato plant. In the week leading up to the Produce Show, exhibitors will be contacted to arrange a day & time for their entry to be weighed. There will be two prizes awarded in this class: one for heaviest overall yield, and one for the heaviest individual potato from the harvest. Exhibitors wishing to take part in FV14 need to express interest **by 8<sup>th</sup> April** either by phoning Jan Pilgrim (01653 648148) or Dave Gaskell (01653 648394) or by emailing [terringtonvillagehallinfo@gmail.com](mailto:terringtonvillagehallinfo@gmail.com). Seed potatoes and growing bags will then be supplied to interested exhibitors in April. If you still have a usable growing bag from last year then please let us know when you register interest.

**Note 3:** For junior classes J6, J12 and J18, the Village Hall will supply a few sunflower seeds which entrants can then plant into the ground or into a container and cultivate as they wish. In the week leading up to the Produce Show, exhibitors will be contacted to arrange a day & time for their sunflowers to be measured. A judge will visit your garden at the agreed time to measure the tallest sunflower. Exhibitors wishing to take part in this class need to express interest **by 8<sup>th</sup> April** either by phoning Jan Pilgrim (01653 648148) or Dave Gaskell (01653 648394) or by emailing [terringtonvillagehallinfo@gmail.com](mailto:terringtonvillagehallinfo@gmail.com). Seeds will be supplied to interested exhibitors in April.



## **Timetable**

### **SUBMISSION OF ENTRY FORMS - WEDNESDAY 7<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER**

The village hall will be open between 6pm and 8pm on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September for the receipt of entry forms and associated entry fees. If you are unable to enter your form that day, please ensure that you return your form and exhibit fees to the Village Show Secretary, Jan Pilgrim, by 8pm on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September.

### **ON THE SHOW DAY ITSELF ..... SATURDAY 10<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER**

- 8:00 am** Doors open for exhibitors to bring in their exhibits and set up their displays
- 9:59 am** Displays of all exhibits to be completed and staged and ready for the show
- 10:00 am** Doors closed!!
- 10:30 am** Judging of all show exhibits
- 2:00 pm** Show Opens
- 3:15 pm** Winners announced and trophies presented
- 3:30 pm** Raffle of exhibits (exhibitors can remove their exhibits if they wish)
- 4:00 pm** End of Show

## EXHIBIT ENTRY FEES AND ADMISSION TO THE SHOW

Exhibit fees are Adult 75p per Class entered, Junior (16 or under) 25p per Class entered. Exhibits will not be accepted without the correct fee.

The show will be open to the public from 2pm on Saturday 10th September. Admission charge is Adults £1, Juniors (ages 16 & under) and exhibitors will be admitted free of charge.

## SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Entries are invited from all residents of Terrington, Wiganthorpe or Ganthorpe
2. The junior Classes are open to all juniors (16s and under) regardless of residency
3. Judges will not be residents of the parish villages and exhibits will be 'anonymised' so that the judges will not know which exhibits have been submitted by which exhibitors
4. Juniors may enter the non-Junior Classes where their work will be judged on an equal standing with adults (as the judges will not know that the exhibit is from a junior)
5. Entry forms and exhibit entry fees must be received **by 8pm on Wednesday 7th September**
6. Individuals can submit entries across as many Classes as they like (as long as each has its own entry fee) but can submit no more than one exhibit in any one Class
7. No single exhibit can be entered in more than one Class
8. All produce must be home grown, and adult craft must be the work of the exhibitor unless stated in the Class entry schedule. Entering another person's work in your name will lead to disqualification
9. The Village Show Committee reserve the right to reject entries without giving a reason, or cancel any Classes in which there are insufficient entries, or to withhold any award. Exhibitors affected will be informed of any such decision
10. The judges are empowered to disqualify any exhibit that does not comply with the schedule
11. The Village Show Committee will not be responsible for any accidents or loss of or damage to exhibits, but reasonable care will be taken to prevent any such occurrence
12. Cups and trophies awarded for the best exhibit in each Category can be held by the winners for one year but must be returned prior to next year's show. Trophies awarded for the best exhibit in each Junior Category can be kept by the winners
13. Objections, if any, must be given to the Village Show Committee on the day of the show. Their decision is final.
